

LEARNING AT HOME

Parent Quick Guide for Remote Learning and Live/Recorded Lessons At Churchstanton Primary School

Teachers and staff will:

- Teachers will set work for the children they teach. Where there are staff absences, teachers or teaching assistants may be asked to set work for children in the other classes.
- Work set each day will include reading; writing, grammar/spelling; maths; and another curriculum subject that would have been taught in school. Remote learning will mirror learning in class wherever possible.
- The amount of learning set will follow the Government guidelines; R 1-2 hours per day, KS1 3 hours per day and KS2 4 hours per day.
- Work set will allow for flexibility with family commitments and pressures. It will be accessible and of a
 good quality for the pupils. The work set will not be so onerous that it creates additional pressure in the
 home or adversely affects well being.
- Teaching will be provided as a combination of video links, teaching resources e.g. reference texts to read or online resources, and related activities for the children and recorded lessons.
- Work will be uploaded on the Google Learning platform with weekly timetable of learning for families via Google Classroom.
- As children may need to share computers with the adults in the house or other children, teachers will ensure there are several activities each day that can be completed offline. Additional devices are being sourced and will be distributed according to need.
- Teachers will set work that avoids the need to print worksheets where possible. Hard copies will be made available to those pupils who need them. Parents should make sure these are collected promptly each week.
- Teachers and teaching assistants may provide work and may lead online lessons or pre-record sessions.
- Feedback will be given using Google Classroom or in books. Teachers will want to see that pupils respond to this feedback.

Pupils should:

- Pupils should log in to their work each day and try to complete all the activities set within the deadlines given.
- Pupils should log in to a live Google Meet/Lesson online wearing appropriate clothing and in a family room in their house not their bedroom.
- Pupils need to behave as they would in school during a live lesson online.
- Pupils need to be supportive of their peers and be kind when using Google Classroom acting in line with our e-safety policy and school behaviour policy.

Parents/ Carers should:

- Alert the school or teacher if your child is unwell and unable to access their learning.
- Support your child to complete the activities.
- Liaise with the class teacher via the class email account if you have any worries or concerns.
- Ensure your child is supervised during online activity—making sure they use the internet safely and adhere to the points above.
