Dear Parents and Carers,

Preparations are well underway for our Christmas performances that, as you know, will be recorded this year. My Headteacher colleagues and I were very disappointed to see the contradictory messages coming from the Government this week and in particular, the Prime Minister, who seems *not* to be aware of Local Authority alerts as a response to local infection rates. It is easy for politicians to make popular statements that appeal to the public, but we made the very difficult but necessary decision to record our celebrations again this year in an effort to safeguard your family Christmas celebrations. Cramming over 100 people into our hall, even with ventilation and other precautions in place, is not a risk we felt was worth taking. Instead, you as parents will have a professionally produced DVD to keep of your child's performance forever. All I have is a vague memory of my sons dressed as a cow and a shepherd and would have loved a video to look back on now! Thank you to all parents and carers who have shown understanding of the situation and supported our decision.

Mrs Berry has been rehearsing with the choir and both KS2 classes and is very pleased with progress so far. Mrs Holt and KS1 are very excited to be able to share their production of "The Sleepy Shepherd" very soon. Tea-towels at the ready!

The children will be visiting St Peters & St Pauls Church during the last week of term to take part in a Christmas Tree decorating festival. The children have all made individual decorations to hang on the tree for a special Christmas celebration where many local groups and businesses have sponsored a tree to raise money. Our theme was Gratitude. Do try and make time to visit as it promises to be really beautiful.

Our school Christmas Tree is up and has been beautifully decorated by our Year 6 pupils as is our tradition here at school. The tree was kindly donated to us by Langford Lakes Christmas Tree Farm and is a 7ft Nordman Fir - very impressive (even more impressive than the one in Trafalgar Square!) As it will last for a good few weeks and is a "no drop" variety, we thought it would be wonderful to raffle the tree off so that someone can take it home on the 17th December to enjoy for the rest of Christmas. Just a friendly reminder...



COVID update

Just a reminder of the procedures for parents if your child is displaying any of the symptoms associated with Coronavirus.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID-19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, please **DO NOT** send your child to school. Contact the school office and leave a message on **01823 601345** <u>and</u> email **sch.105@educ.somerset.gov.uk and your child's class account** to be sure that the message is received. You should organise for your child to take a PCR test via the NHS online portal or by calling 119. Members of the household do not need to isolate unless they themselves have symptoms.

Symptoms of COVID 19

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

•new continuous cough and/or

•high temperature and/or

•a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

Do:

•wash your hands with soap and water often - do this for at least 20 seconds

•use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available

•wash your hands as soon as you get home

 cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze

•put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
