- Electricity—brightness of lamps and volume of buzzers linked to number and voltage of cells in a circuit.

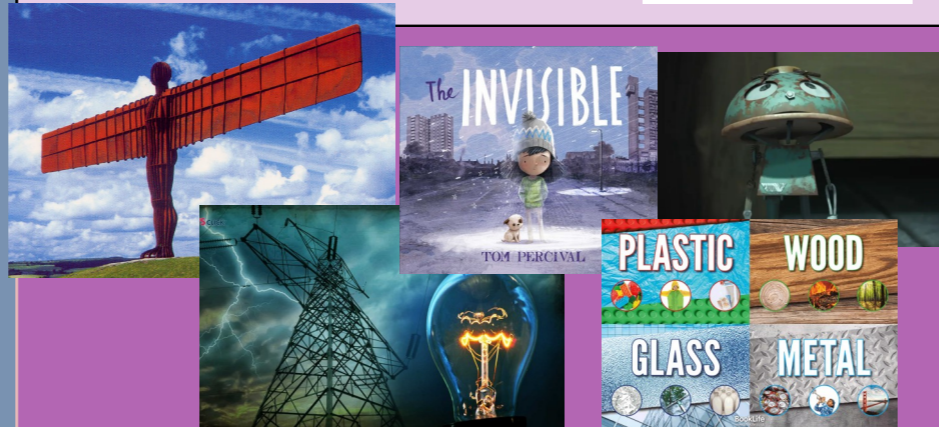
