Squirrel Class

In Squirrel class we have begun to think in detail about the topic of 'Africa' which is inspired by our trip to Bristol to see The Lion King in theatre.

Our class will be focusing on South Africa, and we will be creating textile artwork based around the style of African artist, Billie Zangewa. She uses experiences from her life to create her artwork. The children will be using their experience of The Lion King to create their own textile art from a favourite memory they have about the trip.







We are enjoying reading about Akimbo and the Lions, a book about a boy on an African animal reserve. We will be using this, as well as our other learning around Africa to inspire our narrative stories.

Badger Class

This week, Badger Class, along with the rest of the school, have started their new topic of Africa—which is linked heavily to our trip to see 'The Lion King'. Our class will be focussing particularly on the country of Ethiopia. We have learned where it is and have begun to learn about the sorts of landscapes the country has. Our class reader, 'The Fastest Boy in the World', is also

set in Ethiopia.

We have been lucky enough to begin cricket coaching in our PE lessons this week

(this will continue until the Easter holidays). The children were learning about throwing and catching this week, as well as how to get into a good catching position. Thanks must go to Mrs Adams for organising this opportunity.

Most well-known social networks have an age restriction of at least 13, meaning that it can be difficult to teach children how to use social media safely, without the risk of exposing them to unsuitable experiences.

Internet Matters have put together a useful list of social media apps which are child-friendly and they say are 'designed to help children learn how to interact with each other and share safely online.'

COVID update



Just a reminder of the procedures for parents if your child is displaying any of the symptoms associated with Coronavirus.

Updated March 2022.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID-19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, please **DO NOT** send your child to school. Contact the school office and leave a message on **01823 601345** <u>and</u> email **sch.105@educ.somerset.gov.uk** and your child's class account to be sure that the message is received. You should organise for your child to take a PCR test via the NHS online portal or by calling 119. Members of the household do not need to isolate unless they themselves have symptoms.

Information on the changes to the self-isolation period for individuals who test positive for COVID-19.

This change came into effect in England on Monday 17 January and applies to **all positive cases**, regardless of vaccination status. People who are self-isolating with COVID-19 have the option to reduce their isolation period after **5 full days** if they test negative with an LFD test on **both day 5 and day 6** and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be <u>reported to NHS Test and Trace</u>.

If the result of either test is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

The new rules also apply to people who are already isolating – so if someone was already isolating before Monday 17 January, they can take LFD tests on day 5 and 6 and if they are both negative and they have no temperature they can end their isolation.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10-day period of self-isolation. Further <u>information on self-isolation</u> for those with COVID-19 is available.
